2024 NOGAP HIGHLIGHTS

- NoGap continues its activities and has increased the number of weekly opening days. The association is now open from Tuesday to Saturday.
- The number of registered members is 153;
- At the end of 2024, the NoGap association received the **5x1000** funds allocated to it, which will be managed in 2025.
- We launched an inclusive tailoring space thanks to funds from the 8x1000 of the Waldensian Church;
- We inaugurated the Piccola Biblioteca Ex Libris at the end of December with our own funds;
- We started two new services: Inside-Out and the library;
- Two young people have started or continued a professional internship experience;
- Three new projects have been approved;
- Our presence on social media has grown, reaching 775 followers on Facebook and 175 on Instagram.





Our Services: Administrative Support Desk

In 2024, NoGap continues to provide 38 young people with support in managing their personal expenses. Young people, families, and legal guardians can rely on NoGap for information on personal spending and access to paper documentation. This helps ensure a proper and efficient handling of expenses, promoting transparency and sound financial practices for each individual.



Our Services: INSIDE OUT

As of June 2024, NoGap has launched a new service aimed at supporting the autonomy of young people who have just completed their therapeutic program and choose to remain in the Orvieto area.

The goal is to provide them with a point of reference following a highly protected experience like that of a residential community.

As of today, the service offers:

- A workshop on cooking and nutrition education
- Support for professional internships (searching for opportunities, liaising with companies and young people, evaluation interviews)
- Weekly sharing meetings every Thursday



Our Services: Ex Libris LIBRARY

On December 23, 2024, NoGap inaugurated a small library aimed at creating a space for reading, book displays, and borrowing. The goal is to encourage reading among the young people we support.

Our Workshops:

Inclusive Communication Lab Editions I & II

From January to June 2024, the first edition of the Inclusive Communication Lab was held. This six-month course, in collaboration with painter Flaminia Verdoni, focused on the theoretical and practical learning of basic artistic techniques. The aim was to promote active collaboration among the youth in the community in shaping NoGap's communication activities.

At the end of the first edition, an Art Brut exhibition titled "What You Can't See" was held at the Luigi Fumi New Library in Orvieto.

In November 2024, the second edition began, focused on decorative art and illustration.

The goal of the course is to allow participants to explore expressive techniques to create patterns that will serve as the foundation for a small production chain in collaboration with future workshops.

This project addresses the issue of gender-based violence by giving voice to women and involving youth in social transformation through art therapy and artivism. In 2024, two international meetings were held:

- March in the Netherlands, hosted by partner organization Stichting art. I
- October in Spain, hosted by partner INTRAS

In Italy, NoGap implemented:

- An art therapy workshop led by psychotherapist Marianna Damario with 15 young women participants
- An artivism workshop that produced informational flyers
- A five-day artistic residency involving partners femLENS and Stichting art. I, with participation from students at the Orvieto Art High School and the Lahuén community. The outcome was a **ZINE** on gender-based violence.

This project aims to foster a critical understanding of the global interdependencies behind gender-based violence and sexual exploitation. WeLENS explores the root causes of these phenomena from a perspective that respects the specific contexts of the involved countries: Martinique, France, Italy, Estonia, Greece, Mexico, Guyana, and Argentina.

In 2024, the educators and social workers from the ten organizations in the partnership took part in two thematic roundtables:

- 1. The first took place in Paris in May and focused on sharing knowledge about the concepts of feminism, the intersectional approach, and gender-based exploitation.
- 2. The second was held in Puebla, Mexico, in November, and addressed prostitution and trafficking.

The main goal of these thematic roundtables is to foster a shared understanding within the partnership of sexual violence and exploitation, as well as the global interconnections underlying these issues. Professionals from different countries, sectors, approaches, and techniques had the opportunity to exchange knowledge, skills, and experiences in order to develop a **Toolkit** with training modules for practitioners. This collaborative effort aims to build a global, cross-sectoral, and intersectional approach to the issue.

"Threads of Autonomy", funded by Cassa di Risparmio di Orvieto and the 8x1000 of the Waldensian Church, aims to promote the work autonomy of young people with dual diagnoses by creating a professional tailoring space.

In 2024, the lab space was set up, and two tailoring courses were held in collaboration with the MIR Social Cooperative of Orvieto. 14 young people participated.

Training focused on producing a single garment – the **overalls** – in various styles. Overalls were chosen as they are inherently inclusive, being unisex and adaptable to all body types. This focused approach also made the learning more accessible, given the participants' limited prior experience in tailoring.
